
Dear Colleagues,

Annual Scientific Congress 2025 — what to expect

The planning for this year's Congress is in full swing. This year the Annual Scientific Congress will be held in Windhoek at Arebbusch Travel Lodge from the 20th to 22nd November 2025. There will be 3 evening functions to catch up and reconnect with everyone. Thursday night finger food, Friday night pizza and wine, and on Saturday a lekker braai.

We have added an additional day to the congress, Sunday the 23rd of November. It will be divided into two sections; Wildlife and Small Animals, the slots will be filled with more interesting topics, but most important of all, there will be time for discussions.

VAN Antibiotic Amnesty Project

VAN will start a project in collaboration with GEKA Pharma to support and contribute to awareness creation relating to antimicrobial resistance and to make an active difference from VAN's side.

The project will create awareness among public, clients, farmers, and hopefully will reach a lot more people.

The mission of this project is to specifically create awareness about correct disposal of unused or expired antimicrobials safely and the importance of doing so, but also the consequences of incorrect disposal.

To create awareness, stickers will be created that will be pasted on all dispensed antimicrobials and so encouraging the clients and farmers to bring back expired or unused antibiotics, but also to make them aware of the importance of correct disposal.

The antimicrobials returned will be collected and destroyed correctly, free of charge with proud support from GE-KA Pharma.

This project will specifically be available for free to clinics where either the owners are VAN Members or the majority of staff (70%) are VAN

Members.

The project will officially be launched in November and will continue for a trial period of I year.



Recognizing and managing medical errors By Dr Ladan Mohammad—Zadeh

What is Patient Safety?

World Health Organization "the absence of preventable harm to a patient and reduction of unnecessary risk.

Adverse event vs Sentinel event:

Sentinel event:

- Event or outcome that warrants immediate investigation
- Usually defined as resulting in temporary or permanent severe patient harm
- Medical error, adverse event, or nonmedical event

Adverse event:

- Unintended or unanticipated outcome or response to medication, procedure or environment.
- Does not always result in patient harm

Categories of Errors:

Errors of commission

Simply doing the wrong thing or doing the right thing the wrong way

Errors of omission

Best course of action for a patient (medication or procedure) is NOT taken

E.g. not giving diuretic to a patient in CHF based on radiographs

Errors of communication

Biggest gray-area

Client-said vs doctor-said

Miscommunication regarding an agreed upon procedure

Elective procedure during an urgent surgery (mass removal, spay)

Errors of context

Errors stems from not taking patient's unique situation into account

Giving high dose aminoglycoside to patient with acute renal injury

Giving ivermectin to a dog with a known MDR-I mutation

Putting a blanket in a kennel with a dog with a documented history of eating blankets

Diagnostic errors

Missing obvious orthopedic injury

Missing severe biochemical abnormalities

Misinterpreting result of metabolic test

Examples of drug errors "5 Wrongs of medications"

- Wrong patient
- Wrong drug
- Wrong dose
- Wrong route
- Wrong time

Contributing factors to drug errors:

Patient is not labelled

Transcription errors

Illegible handwriting

Decimal point

Calculation error

Mistaken ml for mg vice versa

Non-uniformity of how drugs are ordered/documented

Some use mg, others use ml

Near-homonyms

Errors can be fatal!!

More Contributing factors:

Patients not labelled

Patients that look similar

Patients that have similar names

Doctor fatigue

Distractions

Assumptions

Case Example:

Case I: Acepromazine

8-week-old puppy diagnosed with Parvovirus.

Sedation required for IV catheter placement

Intended dose 0.05 mg/kg IV

Delivered dose 0.5 mg/kg IV

Puppy showed signs of heavy sedation

Owners were immediately notified.

BP checked q 15 minutes for 1 hour, then hourly for 2 additional hours. Never became hypotensive.

Already on fluid therapy.

Did not change what therapies were administered or duration of hospitalization.

Sedation wore off after 8 hours.

Case 2: Activated Charcoal Mishap

Dog presented after ingesting Bromethalin.

Dog was intubated, and gastric lavage was performed.

Orogastric tube was removed and an 8 Fr red rubber catheter passed into stomach for activated charcoal administration.

When the dog was extubated there was charcoal at the end of the tube.







Owner was notified immediately.

Hospital assumed financial responsibility for all related treatment.

Patient placed on a ventilator that day.

Arrested 48 hours later.

Case debriefing: How could this have been prevented?

What to do when an error occurs:

Determine if a sentinel event has occurred Fill out a sentinel event report Investigate cause Implement new policy or training

Sentinel Event log:

Simple document with pertinent information.

Date/Time
Description of the event
Action taken at the time of the event
Outcome

Communicate! Don't cover up!

Medical record must continue to reflect actual events - errors included

Use error as a training tool, not a blaming tool

A single mistake is not a fireable offense.

May help identify trends in your hospital:

Protocol problem Medication problem Employee problem Equipment problem
